


1. The B.Sc (Maritime Hospitality Studies) course was introduced as a pre-sea course vide Training Circular No.2 of 2010 dated 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2010 for the students of hospitality segment to meet the challenges of working on high seas and fulfilling all the IMO regulations required for employment on board.


2. The modalities of conduct of B.Sc (Maritime Hospitality Studies) course were reviewed by the Directorate in consultation with stakeholders. It has been decided that henceforth, this course will not be regulated by the Directorate General of Shipping. The institute may conduct this course as non-DGS approved course and also may take necessary approval from the designated approving authority in respect of this course. Accordingly, the Training Circular No.2 of 2010 dated 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2010 stands withdrawn with respect to any future course of B.Sc (MHS) that an institute may like to conduct. However, the batches admitted prior to issue of this circular will remain "course approved by the Directorate General of Shipping" and the institute must complete the ongoing batches of this course.
